Re: Mail-Order Abortion Drugs

Dear Mr. President and Acting Attorney General Blanche:

On behalf of attorney and law student members of Christian Legal Society in every state, we write to ask that your Administration, acting through the Justice Department, not oppose state laws prohibiting the sale of mifepristone and other abortion drugs. We ask that, instead, the Justice Department support the states, including in any lawsuits, to combat these drugs that kill unborn human life and that target vulnerable women without adequate warning and doctors' care. This Administration has done much to protect unborn life, for which we (and millions of future Americans) give thanks. But the victory over *Roe v. Wade* and the potency of pro-life laws in the states is being circumvented in the mail. It is estimated that over half the abortions occurring in the U.S. today are because of the unregulated access of mail-in poison.

There is no medical question that these drugs are not only lethal to unborn life, but also pose significant health risks to the mother. The risks are multiplied when these drugs are shipped over state lines and administered without proper medical supervision. This Administration, as you know, has no higher duty than to defend the life and health of our citizenry. Yet, if the Justice Department withdraws its firepower, it increases the chances that mothers will continue to remain vulnerable to marketing by abortion pharmaceutical companies. Thanks in part to Supreme Court justices nominated by the President, the law knows no constitutional right to pre-born infanticide. Why would the Justice Department no longer stand with these state attorneys general against this lethal trade?

We know you care about unborn Americans. Please do not retreat from their defense in this watershed struggle for life.
